



Music Cowl

This is the matching head covering for the Music Coat. It may be worn up over head, down around neck and shoulders, or not at all depending on the weather.

SKILL LEVEL: Advanced Beginner/Intermediate

YARN DESCRIPTION:

LionBrand Hometown USA (100% Acrylic; 142g/6oz/81yd/74m - Super Bulky (6); Mach Wash/Dry)

- A - Portland Wine [3 skeins]
- B - Pittsburg Yellow [1 skein]

CROCHET HOOK: N(13)/9mm *or size needed to obtain gauge*



OTHER MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Stitch Markers (or substitute with gold safety pins)
- Lg Blunt tip plastic needle
- Lg Blunt tip metal needle

GAUGE DATA:

HDC: 9sts by 6 rows = 4in/10cm

Notes: Read ALL instructions thoroughly BEFORE starting to crochet.

- *Complete a gauge swatch prior to starting this pattern.*
- *Place a stitch mrkr (or gold safety pin) to mark beginning of each round.*
- *Cowl body and band are worked as one piece, in the round.*

Abbreviations Used:

Sc = single crochet	Slst = slip stitch	Mrkr(s) = marker(s)
Hdc = half double crochet	Ch = chain	Beg = beginning
Dc = double crochet	St/Sts = stitch/stitches	Yo = yarn over

Band:

Chain 72 sts. Join with slst, ensuring not to twist chain, to form a ring.

1. Using yarn B, ch1; 1sc into same ch. *1dc into next ch, 1sc into next ch*; repeat * * around. Join w/slst to 1st st.
2. Ch3, (counts as 1st dc). *1sc in next dc, 1dc n next sc*; repeat * * around. Join w/slst to top of ch3.
3. Ch1, (counts as 1st sc). *1dc in next sc, 1sc in next dc*; repeat * * around. Join w/slst to 1st sc.

4. Repeat step 2. {4rounds = 2in} Cut yarn leaving 3-4" tail.

Body:

Attach yarn A with ch1.

5. Yo, insert hook into same st, yo and pull thru; insert hook into next st, yo and pull through – 4 loops are now on hook; yo and pull through all 4 loops.
6. Hdc in each remaining st around; slst to join. Ch 1.
7. Repeat steps 5-6, until piece measures 24-28in, depending on slouch preference.
8. Cut yarn leaving a 6" tail, fasten off and weave in all loose ends.

Finishing/Blocking:

1. Machine wash in warm water with cold rinse. Tumble dry on low-medium heat.
